- 6. **Insects**; Termite damage, winter-nesting bees, ants, spiders and so forth can infest any modern conventionally built home... but whereas most log homes are constructed of types of wood such as cedar, this would never be a problem. Cedar

- and other aromatic type woods of a similar kind, have natural insect repellent in the oils which naturally permeate such woods. Much like a cedar chest is used to stow away woolen things to keep moths from consuming them.
- 7. **Expense**; In the case of log homes kits, which by the way is how most log-built structures are made today, the expense of both time and money is drastically reduced. Construction time used to take many months, perhaps more than a year but with pre-milled logs shaped to precise specifications in a factory setting, parts numbered in the order of construction, and all delivered to the construction site with most of the work done for you, building it can now take a mere few short weeks. Due to the way such pre-milled logs are produced, it also creates the situation of the lowest per-log cost there can possibly be. This is why log cabin kits are the most sought after means of achieving log home living today.

Going solar is a decision that needs to be applauded, but then comes another decision - should you be on-grid or off-grid?

There are big differences between the two, and even if you decide to be on-grid, there are still more choices to be made.

So, let's examine the various options and the pros and cons of each.



Off-grid

If you make the decision to go for total electrical independence and to live off-grid, then you are to be congratulated because you've just got rid of that monkey on your back called the utility company and no longer have to dread the seemingly ever-increasing electricity bill. That's the main advantage of living off-grid and one of the main reasons most people decide to do so.

Off-grid systems are especially cost-effective for people in rural or remote locations, where running a connection from the grid to a remote location can cost upwards of \$20 per foot. So, if your property happens to be several miles from the utility, running an extension out to your property can prove very costly, and would probably justify the expense of an off-grid solar electric system.

Another advantage of living off-grid is that it forces people to think very carefully about when and how they use their electricity, thus promoting more efficient use thereof. After all, if most of your electricity is generated during the daytime, you'd probably want to re-think doing your laundry at night.

The major disadvantage of off-grid systems is the expense, as, in addition to the system itself, you also need backup storage for night-time and inclement weather. Adding a battery backup can be very costly. Not only that, but battery life is another issue, since most have a useful life of only 10 years or so, even if carefully maintained, and would need to be replaced, leaving the problem of disposal of the old battery.

On-grid With Battery Backup

OK, so you've decided to go solar, and remain connected to the grid, so you get the best of both worlds - you're generating your own electricity and feeding any excess back into the grid for credit or later use. Great. But, then, you want to take it one step further and make sure you're covered in case of a power outage, for which you'd need a battery backup. You then have the headache of disposing of your old battery once it's run its course, as described above, along with the additional expense of the battery. But, if

having your cake and eating it, electrically, is what you're after, then this may be the way to go.

On-grid

Having a solar electric system installed while still living on-grid means that the utility itself acts as a giant battery for you, allowing you to feed any excess electricity back into the grid for you to use later in the day or to get credited for it if it's not used. This is a concept called net metering, which is becoming more popular in the US as more states push for wider acceptance and implementation of solar energy.

The big advantage of this type of system is that you don't need to buy a system to cover all your electrical needs. You can buy a system to cover just a certain percentage of your electrical usage, which will keep your costs down. Since PV systems are modular, you could then choose to expand your system using the savings you've already realized from the system you've been using.

One of the disadvantages of on-grid systems is that you're not completely free of the whims and fancies of the utility companies, so, even though your system offsets the cost of your electricity bill, whatever you use from the grid is still subject to rate increases. Also, if you're operating without a battery backup, and there's an outage, your system will shut down also, leaving you without power. This is not as big a problem as it used to be, since the grid is stable in most areas, but it's still a possible inconvenience.

These are the main types of solar electric systems in use today (there will probably be more in the future). They each have their advantages and disadvantages, so it's a matter of determining which fits your budget and your mindset. But, the main thing is making the decision to go solar in the first place, which is great for you and for the environment. From there, it's just a matter of deciding how much energy independence you want and need and when you want it.

5. DIY NOT AS EASY AS IT MAY FIRST APPEAR

The DIY industry is a multi million pound industry with the biggest home improvement suppliers taking millions of pounds every year selling DIY tools and materials direct to the trade and the public.

There is no doubt that DIY is a massive industry with millions of brits spending the weekend sanding floors and painting bathrooms there is no sign of the market slowing down. Some of the growth in the industry could be down to a range of DIY and home improvement programmes on television from changing rooms to DIY SOS many of the celebrity DIY-ers on television make home improvement seem like an easy task.

There are many things to take into consideration before undertaking a large DIY project by you. Safety is one such point that should not be ignored. In 1999 the last time nationally updated statistics were made available there were 200,000 DIY injuries in the UK and 70 deaths. There were 2,506 accidents with power drills 1,920 accidents with circular saws and 622 with chainsaws. The home is one place that you would not expect to be dangerous but every year in the UK more than 4,000 people die in household accidents with another 3 million ending up in accident and emergency departments. Planning and ensuring that you put safety first is key to avoiding any accidents.

Many people will underestimate how difficult undertaking a DIY project can be over half of those that embark on a major DIY project will fail to finish the project or at least fail to finish the project to a good standard. So DIY could be a good option to add value to your home but it may also mean that you are actually damaging your wealth and potentially your health.

Research carried out among estate agents suggests that half done or inappropriate home improvements can wipe off anything between £2,000 and £10,000 of the value of a property. When you consider that a property is the biggest investment that you are likely to make in adult life this is no small amount. If you haven't heard the term "Tiny House" you can assume correctly that describes a very small house, but there is a movement now to build and live in tiny houses bv people who don't necessarily need to. reduce one's carbon foot print and to live without so many material trappings.

In a web search for Tiny Houses you will see some houses that look like little Hobbit cottages, mini-mansions, wood sheds, and just about any architectural style in miniature form. Some Tiny Houses are built on the ground while others are on wheels and appear to be no more than glorified campers.

With global economic concerns, the Tiny House now also seems like the next solution to those who really won't be able to afford larger spaces, along with the utility bills. The definition of a Tiny House is somewhat loose because the dimensions can be from less than 100 square feet to over 800 square feet. Many people would not consider 800 square feet to be a Tiny House as many apartments and even some conventional houses are that size. But I think the distinction may have to do with how many occupants live there.

I used to say in my Feng Shui classes that every person deserves a least 600 square feet of their own. I was not being literal. However, questions often arise regarding whether a house can be too small or too large according to Yin-Yang Theory. Some of the criteria for judging whether a home has good Feng Shui has to do with qi flow. Whether a house is large or small, if it is cluttered or overly filled with furnishings, there may not be enough open space for proper qi flow (air currents). When a house's energy is stifled from lack of space, the occupant's health can be undermined.

I've seen small spaces that were neat as can be and I have also seen palatial homes that were terribly cluttered.

With Feng Shui theory and applications, we are trying to achieve a balance of size in relation to the number of occupants, but it also matters how they furnish that living space, and even to a certain extent how much entertaining they do or if they have pets.

Another design dilemma with the Tiny House is the forced need to use certain areas for multiple purposes. Some Tiny House floor plans have bunk style beds over a living room or over a kitchenette. Like a Studio apartment, both yin and yang activities take place in the same room. This isn't the end of the world, but normally we don't want people to have to sleep in the same room where they conduct business.

So many people now have home offices, but to put this all in 100 square feet can be a conflict of interest. In Xuan Kong Feng Shui we also interpret the energies differently and prescribe different adjustments, based sometimes on how the space is used. This can be a little more challenging when the same room is used for sleeping, eating, studying or business, along with personal relations.

Like an ashram community or any communal living, I think a happy medium for the Tiny House is to be in a Tiny House community, where a group of Tiny House owners can also share some common areas. It also helps if the Tiny House is placed on a good sized piece of land, where a person can enjoy the outdoors and not end up feeling like they are in a kind of prison cell.

Tiny home movement has gained momentum in the last few years. Part of that movement is homes called tiny houses on wheels. They are small houses constructed of standard materials and are built and secured to the frames of trailers, and can be pulled behind a vehicle just like a travel trailer.



These small homes range from approximately 65-140 square feet. Because they are on wheels, they are considered travel trailers, and do not require a building permit. Of course they have to meet Department of Transportation guidelines size limitations, but you can basically much put one anywhere you can place an recreational vehicle. Many people place them in back yards, and use them as spare rooms, or office space. They are also used as primary residences, also in parked in a back yard, RV parks, or placed on personal lots of land.

Often theses homes are self-contained with electrical and plumbing systems. They can be designed to traditional septic systems, and electrical connections, or equipped with holding tanks and electrical connections the same as a travel trailer. You can also live off the grid, and quip these homes with solar or wind power, and water harvesting systems, and composting, or incinerating toilets like you would find on a boat.

If you plan to build your own plans to build your own tiny house on wheels, or purchase a finished home, there are many options to suite your needs and location of your home. Tiny houses on wheels are affordable options if you have a desire to live a more simple life.

1. Gas Grill Cooking

It barely takes 10 minutes for your grill to get hot enough to cook on and compared to other outdoor cooking methods this is very fast.

Another great thing about cooking with a gas grill is the cleanup. It is very easy to clean a gas grill because there are no ashes or mess from charcoal dust or wood. You can let your grill stay hot for ten minutes after you are done cooking and scrape it down a bit and you will be all set. The heat will clean the grill on its own quite well.

The only downside to cooking with a gas grill is that you are going to taint the flavor of the food you cook with the gas a little bit. This doesn't bother most people and you can use wood chips to help give your food a bit more flavor. If you use wood chips make sure you soak them in water for a while before you put them on the grill.

2. Charcoal Grill

A charcoal grill may be a better way to cook if you don't want to taint the flavor of your food. There is nothing like getting that good smoky flavor into your food from the grill. Plus charcoal grills are much cheaper than gas grills because they are much simpler. There are many benefits to using a charcoal grill.

You can still use wood chips to help add flavor to your food and if you get the right tools you can light the charcoal and be ready to cook in about 20 minutes. This is a great way

to cook outside if you don't want to use gas, but you want to grill out anyway. You can lock in the great smoky flavor by using a charcoal grill and in most cases it is not as expensive.

Clean up is a bit more strenuous than using a gas grill, but most charcoal grills will have a way that you can dump the dust and ashes pretty easily. This is not much different than unhooking the tank from a gas grill every time it needs to be filled. You will have better tasting food with a more natural flavor with this outdoor cooking method.

3. Over an Open Wood Fire

If you are camping or you have a fire pit in your backyard another choice would be to cook over an open flame with a wood fire. This can allow you to keep the food tasting wonderful and cook in many different ways. You can take advantage of cooking things like cobblers in a Dutch oven or cooking many other dishes with the tools that are made for cooking over an open fire.

When you are camping and you are using a fire to cook most of your meals you can boil many things with simple pots and pans that are made for cooking. However, there are also tools that will allow you to build a pocket style sandwich and put it into the fire to cook. This is great for a pizza type of sandwich or anything else that can be toasted.

Many campers prefer to boil most of the food, but with an open fire you can roast marshmallows, hotdogs, and many other foods with a simple skewer that is long enough to put into the fire without burning your hand. There are many tools to help you cook food while camping and the most natural way to cook outside is over an open fire.

The outdoor cooking method you choose will have a lot to do with what you plan to do with your food. If you are simply cooking outside in your backyard choosing a grill type and cooking is much different than if you are camping out. Campers need more equipment and they have many choices for the tools they can use to cook over an open fire or even with gas burners.

However, if you are after flavor and you are not concerned about saving time you can either use a fire pit or a charcoal grill for your outdoor cooking needs.

Cedar roots have been used for thousands of years by humans. Cedar is a coniferous tree and is native to, North America, Western Himalayas, and the Mediterranean Sea. tall. The name "Deodar" itself came from the Sanskrit word which means "timber of gods." In 1822, the Deodar was first introduced in Europe and later on in the United States.

Next is the Lebanon cedar. This is common in the area of Mediterranean Sea particularly in Lebanon, Syria and Turkey. The Cedar of Lebanon has horizontal branches and soft surface. Depending on each location, the Cedar of Lebanon has its own little distinct characteristics. Meanwhile in Lebanon, Cedar is their main symbol on the flag of their country.

The Northwest coast of America has Yellow Cedar and Red cedar and was an integral part of First Nations history.

Cedar has been used for so many valuable things such as ornaments, perfumes, shingles, furniture, musical instruments and construction. The cedar woods are considered the best piece of material to be used in construction or furniture because it is a natural water-resistant, insect repellant (due to its aromatic smell), and it does not break easily. No wonder cedar woods were used as part of the construction of King Solomon's Temple and King David and Solomon's Palaces.
