#### Which Wood is best for Log Home Construction?

Much has been written about which wood species is best for log home construction. In this article I will draw on fifteen years experience to explain the pros and cons of some of the common wood species used commercially for log cabin construction.

Lodge pole pine is probably one of the most common and widely used wood species for log wall construction. It tends to be straight with low taper due to the slow growth associated with the dry climate where it is found. It is moderately strong and has low to moderate shrinkage during the seasoning process. Lodge pole Pine offers only moderate to low bug and decay resistance and great care must be take to ensure that the logs are treated for insects and decay.

Spruce is another species that is commonly used in log construction. Spruce is widely used in the Interior of British Columbia when many of North America's log homes come from. Spruce usually grows straight with very little taper making it a good candidate for log construction. However, it is common for Spruce to grow with a spiral grain. Spiral



grain logs should not be used in construction and doing so can have disastrous results. Spruce, like Pine is moderately strong and has moderate shrinkage during the seasoning process; and like Pine it offers only

low insect and decay resistance. Spruce logs tend to need more maintenance than some of the other species especially Douglas fir and Western Red Cedar.

Douglas fir is a great choice for log shell construction as it grows straight with low taper and is very strong. However, Douglas fir, like Spruce, can grow with a spiral grain. Spiral grain logs should not be used in log wall construction if possible. Douglas fir logs are very strong and are well suited for beams and purlins. Douglas fir has moderate shrinkage and moderate to high insect and decay resistance. Douglas fir log home tend to look more uniform than others because of the low taper.

Western Red Cedar (WRC) is the final and in my opinion the best choice for log home construction. Quality WRC logs have low to moderate taper and low moisture content. WRC logs will shrink the least of all species of wood during the seasoning process. WRC is almost always straight grained and offers high natural insect and decay resistance. WRC is moderately strong and thus ideal for log wall construction. WRC is also the only species that grows with the "butt flares" that are becoming increasing popular in log homes. The flares offer the customer a way of making their home unique and give it a more rustic and "hand-crafted" look that differentiates it from the cookie-cutter style of log homes found in many areas.

Before choosing the logs for your home, you should do some investigation into what is available in your area. The logs I mention above are by far the most widely used logs today but some may not be available in your area. Having said that, I recommend that your buy the best logs available for your home even if you have to have them shipped to you because remember "the logs are the only portion of your new home that you cannot upgrade later". **O**n a special note there are a few facts which you already know; Log Homes have that unique warm and comfy majestic appearance as well as a charm no other home can declare. Not only are log houses captivating they are very rugged and impressive, energy-efficient and they also have very good resale value.



As a certified home inspector I want to bring out a few facts about buying and living in a log home. For those who are looking over this and live in any type of log home, use this information and facts to take care of your home, but if you happen to be in the process of buying a log house think about these facts when you are looking and you are ready to make an offer to buy.

I've had the privilege of looking at and inspecting log homes which are more than one hundred years old and are generally in good shape simply because they happen to have been well maintained, although I've also looked at fifteen yr old log houses that already have critical failure around the wood logs mainly because of inferior engineering and maintenance.

This information is regarding log homes that are less than 30 years of age. There are many different kinds of logs and styles and designs but a majority of the actual water troubles and maintenance really are basically the exact same. Let me reveal the top 10 listing of things to look for if you are buying a log home

1. Hire a local home inspector to check out your home that has experience with log properties

2. Look and see if you can find any timber decay or any type of water damage and mold on the top of the house logs especially in all the ends and corners on the house logs. You may need to make use of a ladder to examine a majority of these areas

3. Check all of the logs for wide cracks between the home logs as well as chinking, a little bit of splitting of your house logs is to be expected

4. Look to see if you can find any damage from insects; Look along the bottom for termite or pest problems. Always look across the outside walls in addition to all of the gables and overhanging edges and trim for tiny round holes created by carpenter bees

5. Check the decks and porches to be certain they've been connected and flashed properly; it is extremely common to find water damage underneath decks

6. Check the ground clearance, 10 in. is actually recommended; but do not accept any of the logs touching the earth

7. Log structures will likely shrink with time, check all of the interior as well as the exterior doors to be certain they close and open correctly

8. Make sure every one of the windows works correctly

9. Look for darkening logs, mould or possibly mildew on the log structure

10. Check all the accessible rafters as well as the framework specifically where the roofing surface area sits over the logs and there needs to be at least an 18" or more overhang over every log house

Log homes are extremely energy efficient; the actual thermal mass within the logs happens to be the primary factor. The logs really have excellent insulation efficiency which allows the Heating and cooling unit/ units to keep the comfort level inside of the house.

Are you sick of increasing monthly electricity bills and you want to see them disappear by living off grid? It is highly recommended that all solar powered systems be built with a backup battery system. It will come in very handy in times when the weather is not favorable for it, e.g. Rain and thick clouds. Without sufficient sunlight, the system can still continue to function and supply electricity to the house by drawing from the battery system which has been storing the excessively produced electrical power when there was abundant sunlight.

#### 3. Selling Excessively Produced Electricity Back to the Power Company

This situation can happen very frequently to households that stay in areas that receive a lot of sunlight exposure during the day.

Naturally where there is wood, there is always the danger of termites, but this can easily be handled with the right amount of protection. With wooden furniture especially console tables, it is always a good idea to use the varnish as the varnish literally can make the console table and other furniture glow with an inner light and in addition offer then the much needed protection from water damage. The wooden furniture and the console table performs the perfect setting to ones home and they often are the best furniture that one can choose if one wants ones room or ones house to be in a 'country living' style **H**ave you heard of the waterless cooking method? It is a relatively new method of cooking that has many advantages. In the past, a lot of household cooking has involved cooking food with water. When cooked in water, however, a lot of the food's nutritional value, not to mention the flavor, is taken away. Waterless cooking allows you to cook



food in it own juices, retaining all the vitamins and minerals as well as most of the original flavor. There is no need to add water to foods (especially vegetables) because the natural moisture in the food is released and the steam created helps the cooking process. The steam is circulated throughout the pot and falls back into the food allowing it to stay moist and juicy.

So what are the advantages to waterless cooking? First of all, it is an easy way to cook. Many times you can use a one-pan cooking method so that all the food (meat, veggies and potatoes) is cooked together. This also allows for easier clean up with only one pan to wash up. And the new waterless cookware, with its superior heat distribution, tends to have less chance of food burning or sticking.

Waterless cooking also tends to cook food a lot faster. With the new waterless cookware available now the heat is evenly distributed along the bottom of the pot or pan. Because of this, there are no 'hot-spots' that may tend to burn your food. The lid of the pot forms a seal, which locks in the heat (as well as the moisture) so the cooking time is decreased.

As mentioned, waterless cooking is a healthy way to cook. None of the nutrients are lost during cooking, and you don't need to add oil to stop the food from sticking to the pan, which also makes it healthier. The natural color and texture of the food is also retained which makes the food more appealing. Foods that are supposed to be crisp tend to keep their crunchy texture as well.

The features of waterless cookware that allow this cooking method to work include a flat bottom on the pots and pans which allow the most efficient means of heat transfer. The flat bottom connects with your stove element better, whether it be the coils of an electric stove or a gas unit, so that the heat transfer is more efficient. The cookware also has an iron core and an aluminum or copper base plate built into it that helps to retain a continuous, constant cooking temperature even after the heating element has been turned off.

Waterless cookware is typically made of high-grade stainless steel, which is better than other traditional pans in a couple of different ways. The stainless steel does not allow the taste of the metal to transfer to your food, as may be the case with aluminum or Teflon-coated cookware. Some companies use surgical stainless steel, which is the highest grade you can get for a real quality product. The stainless steel is easy to clean, durable (enabling it to last an extremely long time) and it allows you to keep your cookware sterilized.

One of the main features of waterless cookware is the special lid that keeps the natural moisture in the food from escaping. The lid forms a seal with the pot and lets the natural juices form into steam so the food cooks in its own natural juices, retaining all the nutrients and original flavors. There is a steam valve that whistles and tells you when you should turn off the heat (once the juices have created sufficient steam). In this way you save energy when cooking and the food is always cooked at a constant temperature.

Although it is referred to as waterless cooking, one thing you should do before cooking with this method is to rinse your food in water and then drain it before cooking. This ensures there will be enough water clinging to the food to create enough steam, mixed with foods natural juices, to cook it properly.

Cooking times with the waterless cooking method is generally a little less than traditional cooking times, depending on personal tastes for doneness. You should always cook your food at medium to low temperatures because the special waterless cookware construction allows the unit to conduct heat in the most efficient manner. You must also resist the urge to lift the lid during the cooking process as this will lengthen the cooking time and may even allow the food to dry out when the steam escapes.

The steam valve will tell you when you should turn off your stove element-when the correct temperature has been reached to allow the food to cook itself. When the steam valve whistles, turn off your stove, but do not lift the lid until the specified cooking time has elapsed-then you can open the lid and serve out your hot food. As a tip, put warm water into the unit after the food has been removed and let it sit while you eat so clean-up will be a snap afterwards.

Most recipes can be adapted (with a few alterations) to using the waterless cooking method as well. You will discover that old favorites will taste better and new recipes will be simple to master. The waterless cooking method is a new and healthier way to cook. It is more energy efficient, allows the food to retain its own juices, texture and color, and is an easy way to cook.

# **12. WONDERFUL CABIN DECKS**

**G**uys, I want you to stare at the photo of this cabin deck. I'll give you a few moments to organize your thought then tell me what you think. \*silence\* "Is there a stronger word than 'exquisite'? That's how I can describe this cabin deck." I agree with you, pal! These cabin decks are simply... exquisite. Did you know that



these cabin decks also require proper maintenance? The decks would not look like this if it were not maintained. If you have a cabin deck, I will tell you some of the ways to keep it looking great. \*winks\*

You have to thank James McFadden from Ezine for the ways. \*winks\* for the first step, of course, you have to clear your deck first. McFadden says, "Don't attempt to work around items such as outdoor furniture or the grill. The first step is to clear the grill of any and all such items from the deck. Keep in mind that they will not be returned for several days."

The second step is to sweep the deck and clear the cracks. It's time to unleash your 'sweeping skills' and turn your deck into a wonderful one. \*winks\* You must sweep away those leaves, dirt, and other debris. Do not finish the sweeping without paying attention to the spaces between the boards. "Leaves can sometimes come to rest in the cracks as they decompose. This can eventually rot the boards," says McFadden. How to clean this? Just use a putty knife to get into these gaps clean.

Thirdly, you must scrub the wood, ladies, and gents. In doing this, you may use bleach. Just dilute the bleach, half and half with warm water. Scrub the wood with a scrub brush and apply the bleach evenly. McFadden doesn't recommend the use of undiluted bleach in scrubbing your deck. Also, do not leave the bleach and water for too long. Rinse the deck thoroughly after a few minutes. If you have plants around, cover them with plastic to avoid contact with the cleaning solutions.

Fourthly, allow your deck to dry. "This is an important part of the process," shares McFadden. "Sealing the deck while wet may trap moisture in the wood severely decreasing the woods life expectancy," he adds. Make sure that the deck is completely dry. It is because the sealant is water repellent, and you will get an "uneven coat." Wait for at least two days depending on the weather.

Lastly, apply the sealer. You should buy a foam roller to apply the sealer to the entire deck surface. Before doing this, you must cover the bottom of your safety slats and rails. "This can protect them from 'wicking' water from snow drifts or water that puddles or seeps into cracks."
